



# Why we are considering a 20mph speed limit

- To address a real danger
- To reduce deaths and injuries
- To reduce accidents
- To make our children and all of us healthier
- To cut delays on the road
- To make our neighbourhoods more pleasant





# Addressing a real danger

- Three children a month are injured by a car in H&F.
- Of a total of 763 people injured in a collision with a car last year in H&F, almost half were cyclists or pedestrians.
- Collisions in the borough have risen ten per cent since 2010.

## Reducing deaths and injuries

 If you are hit by a car going at 30mph, your injuries are eight times more likely to be fatal than if the car is going at 20mph.

#### Reducing accidents

- At slower speeds, drivers have more time to react.
- We already have 20mph limits on more than a third of H&F's roads (see map). When the limits were introduced, injuries from car accidents dropped by between 20 and 80 per cent.

### Making our children and all of us healthier

 By making our streets safer, a 20mph limit would encourage children to walk to school and generally encourage walking and cycling - which are good exercise.

#### Cutting delays

- Car accidents cause congestion, so fewer accidents would mean fewer delays.
- At lower speeds, vehicles flow through junctions more smoothly.

### Making our neighbourhoods more pleasant

- Calmer roads would bring communities together by
   enabling neighbours and their children to get to know one another better.
- The lower, safer speed limit would encourage people to walk or cycle rather than drive, which would reduce pollution from cars.



#### The proposal

We are consulting on whether to implement a 20mph limit across the borough.

#### Which roads?

Options for which roads could be included are shown on the map over the page. Only roads managed by H&F Council would be affected. Roads managed by Transport for London - the A40 (Westway), the A3220 and the A4 (Great West Road) - are not included.

#### Enforcement

The speed limit would be enforced by the police just as the 30mph limit is now. We are not proposing more speed cameras. Our questionnaire asks whether you would also like to see more traffic calming, such as speed humps, in specific areas to help slow traffic.

#### Signs


Each road would be clearly signed at the start of the speed limit, with signs repeated throughout the limit area.



### Raising money from speeding fines

A 20mph scheme would **not** raise money for the council. Only the police are legally able to enforce speed limits and any revenue from fines would go to the Government. Neither the council nor the police will receive any income from this scheme.





#### What happens next?

Please send us your form before 31 July 2015.

We will analyse the responses and the council's Cabinet will then make a formal decision on whether to go ahead. If a 20mph limit is approved, works would start next year and the new speed limit could be in force from autumn 2016.
